


As we are non-profit and reservations and some deposits/payments are required in advance, there are no refunds. However, should it be necessary for you to cancel you may sell your reservation to another member.



ABOUT THE MAY COURT CLUB OF CANADA



The May Court Club of Canada, an iconic Windsor Landmark, is located on Wyandotte Street between Marion Avenue and Pierre Avenue. This incredible charity receives donations of all kinds from the community, turns around and sells these household objects, shoes, clothes, books and toys and uses the profits to do good work in our community. Along with being a thrift shop, and a charitable organization, May Court Club is also a club where members spend time together and socialize. They enjoy potluck dinners, Tea Party Socials, and various outings.

The May Court has a long history (89 years in fact) in Windsor and Essex County. They were responsible for bringing programs like the *Kids on the Block Program, Preschool Programs and of course Breakfast Programs, into our schools*. Once municipal Social Service agencies began taking over many of these programs, May Court found other child-focused organizations in need of help.

May Court Club shop is run entirely by volunteers. They own their building, therefore there is little overhead which means that they are able to direct their profits back into the community. Last year May Court donated \$50,000.00 to 19 local charities. These included *The Therapeutic Riding Association, The John McGivney Centre, Noah's House, New Beginnings* and so many more. May Court is also located in the heart of a neighbourhood that finds itself often in need. Their volunteers answer that call weekly.

Kathy Roy is currently the Past President of the Windsor May Court Club. After a very successful 35-year teaching career with the Windsor Catholic Separate School Board, Kathy retired in 2008 and immediately joined RTOERO. She began volunteering at the May Court Club in 2013.

Post Covid when the shop was able to open its doors again, Kathy became the Tuesday shop manager. She opens and closes, schedules the many volunteers and oversees the receiving donations side of the shop. When asked about the importance of volunteering in retirement, especially volunteering at May Court Club, her answer was simple yet poignant... it fills the need of the retired teacher to continue to do what they did throughout their career in the classroom.

Kathy is looking forward to the goals May Court has set for themselves for 2024. To celebrate it's 90th Anniversary, May Court wants to donate \$90,000.00 to the community. She is calling on the retired teacher community to please consider donating their household items, gently used clothes, purses and shoes, linens and toys to May Court Club. Also, for all you thrift shoppers out there, please stop in the shop and take a look at the wonderful items for sale. You may find that one of a kind outfit or set of dishes you have always wanted. May

Court is open Tuesday to Friday 10:00 AM to 4:00 to receive donations. Just knock on the door, and someone will be happy to help you. Shop is open to customers Tuesday to Friday 1:00 to 4:00. Saturday is 11:00 to 3:00 for customers to shop and to receive donations. Thanks, Kathy, for giving your time, patience and energy to this worthwhile cause.

GRANT REQUEST TO DISTRICT 7 - WINDSOR ESSEX RTOERO

District 7 of the Retired Teachers of Ontario sets aside approximately \$1500.00 yearly in order to provide special grants to local groups and organizations. These grants are awarded based on the following criteria:

- > Groups/ organizations must be non-profit and must not have applied and received a grant within the last 5 years
- Monies received may not be used for honourariums, salaries or travel expenses
- > Intended project must benefit children, seniors or the community in general
- Project must take place during the year in which the grant is awarded
- Involvement of local RTO/ERO members is required. NOTE: When considering the request, some weight is placed on the number of RTO/ERO members participating in the project.
- > Application must be received by January 4th of the calendar year in which the event is to take place
- > Application must be completed in full and be accompanied by:
 - a) a detailed financial statement for the previous 2 years (example -2022, 2023 for a 2024 Project)
 - b) a budget forecasting the projected revenues and expenditures for the PROJECT year (2024)

Applications are due by January. 4, 2024 for events scheduled to take place during 2024. The applications will be reviewed by the Committee at the January, 2024 Executive Meeting and applicants will be notified of the Committee's decision shortly thereafter.
